### **How Many Dinosaurs is Too Many?**

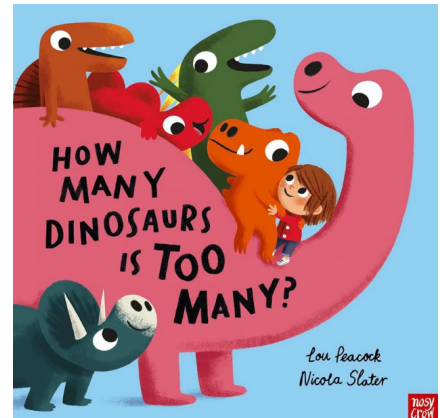
