### **How Many Dinosaurs is Too Many?**

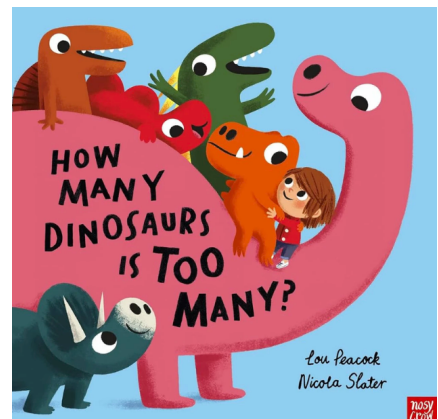

Many kids would love to have a pet dinosaur, but how many do they really want and need? This comical, colorful, counting book reminds one that dinosaurs have not always been known for their best behavior, but one dinosaur can be a great friend.



Looking for some math ideas for your 2- and 3-year-olds? Little children may start to understand the meaning and concept of “one” and “two”—known as “one-to-one correspondence”—even if they can count higher than that. Counting at this age is usually by rote: They’ve mostly memorized the names and order of the numbers without understanding what the numbers signify. One-to-one correspondence means that a child makes the connection between the number word “one” and the quantity it represents. What activities can you do to improve number sense?
